Assignment Objective: Students will: review effective lead pencil, conte, color pencil, pen and ink, brush and ink, pastel and charcoal drawing techniques (mixing, pressure application, spacing, gripping, etc.); review basic color theory; review the meaning of line; review the meaning of value and how to use it to create the illusion of form on paper; review the meaning of abstraction/non representational
 Assignment:

## Part A

Drawing \#1) Create seven value scales. Each scale should use a different medium:

- One using drawing pencil
- One using conte
- One using monochromatic color pencil
- One using pen and ink
- One using calligraphy brush and ink wash
- One using chalk pastel
- One using charcoal


## Requirements:

- Each value scale must be about the size of your open hand $=\mathbf{2}$ points
- Each scale must show a visibly distinct value range from very light to very dark $=6$ points
- Each of the value scales must be fully saturated (thick in layer) $=\mathbf{2}$ points
-worth 70 points
Drawing \#2) - Complete five small abstract or non representational drawings - each design using a different medium $=\mathbf{4}$ points each

Requirements:

- Each drawings should be about the size of your fist
- There is to be no obvious representation in your sketches
-worth 20 points


## Drawing \#3) - complete two of the three options below

- Drawing \#1 Complete a drawing of the table bottle and its shadow:- 8 " in size; no color
- Must be proportionately accurate= $\mathbf{5}$ points
- Must be accurately shaded using two drawing pencils $=\mathbf{5}$ points
- Drawing \#2 - Complete a drawing of the table bottle and its shadow: 8 " in size; color only
- Must be distorted in some way= $\mathbf{3}$ points
- Must be accurately shaded using color= $\mathbf{5}$ points
- Must fill the entire page (touch at least two sides of the picture frame) $=2$ points
- Drawing \#3 - Complete a drawing of the two balls and their shadows: must be between 6-8" in size; color only
- Distort one of the two balls in some way= $\mathbf{3}$ points
- Must be accurately shaded using color= $\mathbf{5}$ points
- Must fill the entire page (touch at least two sides of the picture frame)

# Drawing Terms - form, value, and color: 

Form: A 3-dimensional object - having length, width and depth

Value -The amount of darkness or lightness present on an object

Hatching - Lines drawn next to or parallel to each other usually in a consistent and evenly applied way

Cross Hatching - lines that overlap each other in a consistent and repetitive way

Squirkling - curvey and swirling lines overlapped

Blending - Smudging or rough mixing of lead on paper

Monochromatic color - any color and its tints (lights) and shades (darks)
Complementary colors - colors opposite each other on the color wheel -(red-green, orange-blue, yellow-violet.) They correspond to warm and cool colors.
